b. <u>Resolution #2021-0061 – Approval of work on apron</u>

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners previously authorized Chief Glenn Lockwood to enter into an inter-municipal agreement with the Village of Victor for site improvements in Resolution #2021-0046;

WHEREAS, the Village of Victor has provided an estimate for work to repave the apron facing Adams St in front of the truck bays, including the chiefs' parking area, with 5 inches of type 3 binder as follows:

Removal of asphalt, drainage, and re-grading with Village DPW resources, \$6,048

Installation of 245 tons of type 3 binder through the Ontario County bid, \$23,155;

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners have reviewed this estimate, found they meet the District's Procurement Policy, there are sufficient appropriated funds in the current budget; and are necessary for the safe and efficient operation of the Fire District; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED to authorize the work described in the Village of Victor's estimate;

RESOLVED that the expenses of this work will be assigned to A3410.406.9 – Grounds Maintenance; and,

c. <u>Resolution #2021-0062 - Adoption of Capitalization Policy</u>

On motion of Commissioner Turner, seconded by Commissioner McConnell, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, Town Law 176, the Office of State Comptroller, and best practices of a Fire District requires adoption of various policies and forms; and

WHEREAS the Board of Fire Commissioners, on advice of the Fire District Attorney, have reviewed a proposed policy on fixed asset capitalization, as fully described in Attachment A, and have found it consistent with the objectives of the Victor Fire District; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Fire Commissioners adopts the Capitalization Policy and directs that it be added to the District Policy Book; and,

RESOLVED that a copy of the policy be made available to the members and staff of the Victor Fire District.

d. <u>Resolution #2021-0063 – Resolution to transfer funds from building repair</u> <u>and replacement capital reserve account to the general operating account.</u>

On motion of Commissioner Barry, seconded by Commissioner Turner, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 6-g of the General Municipal Law, as amended, the Victor Fire District does hereby authorize the transfer of a sum not to exceed \$______ from its Building Repair and Replacement Capital Reserve Account to the District's General Operating Account for continued Fire District operations including the acquisition and installation of HVAC improvements for Fire District purposes and services related thereto.

No expenditure shall be made except upon authorization of the Board; and it is further

RESOLVED, that this resolution is subject to a permissive referendum as provided by Section 6-g of the General Municipal Law.

e. <u>Resolution #2021-0064 – Authorization to Replace RTU#3</u>

On motion of Commissioner McConnell, seconded by Commissioner Barry, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, Kennedy Mechanical has notified the Board of Fire Commissioners that the heat exchanger for roof-top unit (RTU) #3 is damaged and beyond repair;

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners previously determined as part of their review of the HVAC Replacement Study from LaBella Associates, DPC, to replace RTUs when they are beyond repair; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners have reviewed written estimates to replace the RTU and found that the contract provided by Kennedy Mechanical Contractors meets the District's Procurement Policy;

WHEREAS, the price of this work will be an amount not to exceed \$11,640, which will be appropriated in part from a transfer from the Building Repair and Replacement Capital Reserve Account to the Operating Account, identified in Resolution #2021-0063, which is subject to a permissive referendum; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Fire Commissioners accepts the proposal by Kennedy Mechanical Contractors dated May 21, 2021, subject to and contingent upon the completion of the permissive referendum process for the transfer of the capital reserve funds described in Resolution #2021-0063; and

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be delivered to Kennedy Mechanical Contractors and Deputy Treasurer Sean McAdoo.

f. <u>Resolution #2021-0065 – Authorization to purchase HVAC controls</u>

On motion of Commissioner Keyes, seconded by Commissioner Turner, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, in October of 2020 the Board of Fire Commissioners received an HVAC Replacement Study from LaBella Associates, DPC, that identified a necessity to replace the existing HVAC air system controllers as a means to provide more efficient heating & cooling of the occupied spaces;

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners have deemed it necessary to replace the existing HVAC air system controllers in their entirety;

WHEREAS, Day Automation provided on May 5, 2021a price of replacement of these controls, including installation, via NYS OGS contract PT-68783;

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners discussed benefits of using state bid versus going to public bid and determined, in their discretion, that the possible savings will not be sufficient for cost of staff time and legal preparations; and,

WHEREAS, the price of this work will be an amount not to exceed \$64,000, which will be appropriated in part from a transfer from the Building Repair and Replacement Capital Reserve Account to the Operating Account, identified in Resolution #2021-0063, which is subject to a permissive referendum; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Fire Commissioners accepts the proposal by Day Automation dated May 5, 2021, subject to and contingent upon the completion of the permissive referendum process for the transfer of the capital reserve funds described in Resolution #2021-0063; and

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be delivered to Day Automation and Deputy Treasurer Sean McAdoo.

g. <u>Resolution #2021-0066 – Authorization to submit for 2021 DEC Volunteer Fire</u> <u>Assistance Grant.</u>

WHEREAS, the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation has announced the 2021 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant program for 50% match up to \$3000 for the purchase of fire suppression equipment used for outdoor, wildland, and/or brush fires;
